Council urges residents to continue helping reduce spread of virus

In Herefordshire, our local Covid case rate remains high so we encourage everyone to wear masks as a matter of personal choice, to help limit the spread. As people across Herefordshire return to their normal routines this week, Herefordshire Council is reminding them to play their part to help keep everyone across the county safe.

The government's Plan B remains in place to help prevent the spread of the highly contagious omicron variant of COVID-19.

Face Coverings

The government lifted face covering guidance from Thursday 27 January, but advises that you continue to wear one in crowded and indoor spaces where you may come into contact with people you do not normally meet. In Herefordshire, our local Covid case rate remains high so we encourage everyone to wear masks as a matter of personal choice, to help limit the spread. All Herefordshire council meetings, being held in-person, are using Covid-secure measures and will be live-streamed to make them as accessible as possible. Councillors may choose to join meetings in person or virtually; however, if not in person they may take part in the meeting but my not vote. For the time being, the Council is asking

staff to continue working from home, unless their role requires them to work from a fixed location.

Bird keepers reminded to follow rules

Avian influenza has been confirmed by Defra at a farm near Ross-on-Wye. The Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) and the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) have confirmed there is avian influenza (H5N1) in a small flock of chickens, ducks and geese at a farm near Ross-on-Wye.

Herefordshire Council has been liaising with the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), and there appears to be no wider risk, but bird keepers are being reminded that they must follow government requirements. The council acted quickly as soon as receiving information from Defra. The result is a loss of livestock to the farmer, whose premises will undergo a total disinfection under Defra and APHA supervision.

Herefordshire Council is currently in the process of writing to or visiting every household within a three-kilometre protection zone of the affected premises, to ensure that poultry keepers are taking the necessary precautions in line with Defra guidance.

Household Support Grant to help low income households this winter

I repeat this this essential message again this month. If you are living in a low income household that receives Universal Credit (at a level below the threshold for free school meals and/or free prescriptions), you can now apply for a one-off payment of £60 to help with food, energy and other essential costs. One-off payment now available to help support vulnerable people and families. The payment is available through Herefordshire Council, which has been allocated over £1million by the government as part of a new Household Support Fund to help vulnerable people and families this winter.

To receive this support you will need to complete a short online application form to verify your identity and provide your bank details for payment. **The deadline for applications is 28 February 2022.**

Community involvement with planning

A Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) sets out how the Council will engage with the community in respect of planning matters.

A statement of community involvement is prepared which sets out the council's policy in respect of consultation on planning matters adopted in January 2017 <u>Statement of community involvement January 2017 (herefordshire.gov.uk)</u>. The proposed revised statement of community involvement would replace this current document.

Extensive review of the planning process leading to the publication of the Localism Act in 2011 and National Planning Policy Framework in 2012, as well as the emerging White Paper for Planning, means there is now far greater emphasis on early engagement with all potentially affected parties. The revised statement of community involvement (URL below) details the various ways in which people are able to be involved in the planning process and the commitment the council has to ensure there is ample opportunity to do so. This document was produced to Full Council on 28th January 2022 for approval by councillors. However, numerous comments were made and the document is to be "tweaked" before printing; therefore, be advised although the document is broadly agreeable there will be changes made e.g. role of ward councillor.

Have your say on the new Herefordshire Local Plan throughout the county is now live and will run until 28 February 2022.

Consultation on the options for the location and scale of new development

The new document, which will replace the current Core Strategy, will determine growth and development across the county over the next 20 years. It will ensure that we deliver the required housing, alongside the jobs, and supporting community infrastructure and services in a way that is appropriate for the rural nature and historic character of the County.

Changes to the Fastershire programme and Gigaclear

Statement from the Leader of the Council c. 28/1/2022

Whilst the county now has over 93% premises that can access superfast broadband which is significant for such a rural area, there were two blows to the broadband deployment plans. These both relate to Gigaclear as the main supplier commissioned by the council through Fastershire to provide a full fibre network across the county. In November one of their subcontractors for build works, Complete Utilities, ceased trading with immediate effect leaving Gigaclear to make sites safe and work with their other subcontractors to pick up the delivery. Whilst this was effectively addressed, a wider issue related to Gigaclear has been

emerging relating to their ability to deliver broadband to parts of our county due to the cost. The main impact is on 2,324 premises in the south of the county still on broadband speeds of less than 30Mbps. The council made the decision to break with Gigaclear for their contracted works in the south of the county and for the areas to be part of the new national Government Project Gigabit programme. Whilst this will take longer to reach some premises it means that, subject to the Government delivering on the programme, a wider area can benefit from gigabit capability. In the meantime the council will support communities affected with a household grant, support for business and continue with the community broadband scheme. I appreciate that residents who had been expecting to receive better broadband will be very disappointed and we will continue to do what we can to press Central Government to provide help.

Repayment to the LEP

The Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) comprises a group of Councils viz. Herefordshire, Shropshire, and Telford and Wrekin known as Marches LEP. This LEP is the method by which the government pays for approved government work to be completed by the respective council. In this instance the repayment relates to a dispute between Herefordshire Council relating and LEP relating to costs to be repaid to the LEP by Herefordshire Council for their cancelling the recent proposal for a 'Bypass' for Hereford.

This matter was brought to light by a recent freedom of information request of Shropshire Council (lead authority) giving information not previously declared by Herefordshire Council.

Statement from the Leader of the Council c. 28/1/2022

"As a result of an FOI request made to Shropshire Council, Cllr Lester stated at the last Cabinet meeting that the Council had reached a settlement to pay £2.3m to Shropshire Council, acting in its capacity as the Accountable Body for the LEP.

This settlement figure arose as a result of Herefordshire Council, Shropshire Council and Marches LEP agreeing to settle all outstanding disputes in relation to the LEP funding of the South Wye Transport Package. The agreement contains confidentiality obligations which mean that I cannot say anything about the settlement without the agreement of the three parties. Such an agreement has not been reached but my understanding is that officers are working on this. Clearly I cannot predict what communication is to be provided but I am pressing officers to provide a full explanation, to which Councillors and the public are

entitled. I am not happy with this situation especially as my ability to answer Councillor questions at this meeting will be very limited.

I have asked the Chief Executive to review all the circumstances which gave rise to this settlement being agreed. Given that the parties ended up in mediation, there was clearly an issue which was disputed strongly by both parties. This investigation will be carried out by our internal auditors SWAP, and will be provided to the audit and governance committee"

Local Parishes News

Upton Bishop: It is expected that all works will be completed by early February. However, the entire junction has been closed to traffic unfortunately, the proposed and approved diversions which included travelling along the A449, A49 and A438 have been circumvented by drivers running parallel to the A449; which has included driving up and along Perrystone Hill – with all classes of vehicles. This has caused extreme problems and danger to the residents. I have spoken with the cabinet member for Highways and Infrastructure and asked him to review the methodology of considering diversion routes, to prevent this type of incident. I have spoken with BBLP and the Police and they have set in train some measures to try to deal with this unwanted incursion of 'A' road traffic onto an unclassified road. The police have introduced marked vehicle patrols, with my urging to be active in enforcing, speeding and driving with undue care or dangerous driving. I have also requested of BBLP senior management that the highways verges be attended to post Old Gore crossroads opening. Also, that the damage to the highway of Perrystone Hill – throughout its length be repaired post Old Gore crossroads opening.

Report fly tippers

If you spot someone fly-tipping

- Make a note of any vehicle used, including model, colour and registration number. If it is safe to do so without being seen, take a photograph or video of the activity
- Note the fly tippers' clothes, and distinguishing features. If you can hear the fly tippers, take note of anything which was said along with the speakers' accents
- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away you were at the time;
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.
