Supporting Ukraine

I am pleased to report many Ukraine families are being housed in Herefordshire. Herefordians continue to give their support to the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. In a matter of days, over 1,100 people have expressed an interest in helping people from the war-torn country. This figure includes 94 'sponsors' - residents who have agreed to open their doors to provide a home for Ukrainian guests. So far, 25 guests have arrived in Herefordshire and a further 248 have registered their interest in moving to the county.

Phosphate planning permission freeze bringing to thaw – provided by fellow councillor



After nearly three years of a moratorium on granting permission for new houses in the Lugg catchment area the council is establishing a process that will start to allow permissions to be given. Currently in the system there are over 2,200 house applications including 500 affordable awaiting determination in the Lugg catchment area and it is estimated the loss to local economy to date is in excess of 400 million, with Herefordshire Council missing out on

additional council tax, loss of section 106 developer funding and NewHomes bonus from the Government.

Herefordshire Council is purchasing ground adjoining certain village sewage works in order to build reed beds to filter out the phosphate over 80 years in accordance with a scheme agreed with Natural England. It takes approximately 45 days for the water to flow through the beds and at the end the water is suitable to drink and has had 99% of the phosphate removed. The Council has purchased sites at Luston and Titley and is in the process of purchasing a third. Initial three million pound funding for this is coming from the Government via a grant from the Local Enterprise partnership and diversion of the New Homes Bonus.

Of the phosphate taken out the equivalent of 80% will then be offered to allow applications to be built. From now on any planning application will need to calculate the amount of phosphate it will use via an agreed process with Natural England and purchase a credit from the council. The existing applications in the system will be offered the opportunity on a first come – first served basis.

There will be variations in costs depending where you build. If you are building in Leominster where your property will link up to the existing system which has a phosphate stripping process already has fitted you will pay probably only £3,500. But if you are building in a rural area where there are villages that do not have such phosphate removal processes you will pay £10.400. There is much still to be worked on and potential for other independent schemes to be matured but thankfully there is some light clearly at the end of this tunnel.

As you know from updates phosphates comes from two main sources – Agriculture and sewage outflows. It is important both sectors are active in limiting the levels of phosphate entering our water systems.

Update on Children's Care services



Many of you will have been shocked and concerned watching the BBC Panorama programme or listened to Radio 4 about Herefordshire Council's children care services.

They identified long established poor practices and procedures involving many children and their families. Regrettably repeated lessons were not learned and there continues to be examples of poor practice even in the last 12

months.

Last year 1100 cases were reviewed with varying degrees of concerns identified. Nationally there is a huge problem with Children's services with a lack of social workers. As a result caseloads per worker increase, difficulties in recruitment mean more agency staff employed and recent high profile national cases such as Baby P in Coventry mean decisions on protection see higher removal of children from family homes.

Last year caseloads per social worker in Herefordshire were running at 40-50, in December were 20-25 with the target being 15. The council has been commented upon regarding poorly prepared case papers and is working with Judge Plunkett and ensuring better prepared court papers go forward.

Challenges remain like changing cultures and finding suitable qualified staff but the council have to get it better. There are many sensitive issues and vulnerable children in our county and we have to ensure that correct decisions are taken regarding their safety and development.

The Government are monitoring the quality and direction of the improvement plan, and the council has identified 11.2million additional funding for 2022/23 for the service.

What are the key organisations that make up the NHS? How can they collaborate with partners in the health and care system to deliver joined-up care?

The Mental Health Collaborative is part of the new Integrated Care System (ICS) which places the duty of all local health and care organisations to work together in partnership on a more formal footing. For our Mental Health Collaborative the ambition is to work together across organisations, to listen to what our communities need and then respond collectively to change the way we design and deliver our services. This way of working enables us to have a more joined up approach to how we plan, fund, deliver and evaluate the quality of what we do, with a particular focus on addressing the inequalities faced by some communities or groups in accessing mental health care.

- Ensuring our roads, public open spaces and streets are accessible, safe, clean and wellmaintained
- Maintaining the delivery of essential services
- Achieving value for money, facilitated by process improvement and transparency through open book accounting

- Note the fly tippers' clothes, and distinguishing features. If you can hear the fly tippers, take note of anything which was said along with the speakers' accents
- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away you were at the time;
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.
