Government grants

Government grants keep being offered to local authorities and Herefordshire Council has plans requested 8 million towards refurbishing the Museum in Hereford and a new library in Maylords. Commendable as the projects are I am not sure the annual revenue implications including business rates that will be payable have been costed.

The Council has put in three bids of 44 million to the national Levelling up fund for projects in Leominster, Ledbury and Ross. Also a further application of 7.6 million to support business growth and development. The UK Shared Prosperity Fund has been established to help address geographical disparities in economic performance and circumstances. In March, government allocated funding to Herefordshire, subject to submitting an Investment Plan on 1 August.

Brookfield school

The Council has accepted a grant over 4 million from the Government which is 70% of the total cost for improvements to Brookfield school which is Herefordshire specialist provision for children with acute needs. Herefordshire Council has agreed at today's meeting to reallocate additional funding towards improvement works at Brookfield Special School, Hereford, as part of a joint funded project with the Department for Education (DfE).

Children's care services

There continues to be concerns regarding children's care services in the County and some questions were asked by members of the public at the full council meeting on last Friday. Despite huge funding being diverted there still remains issues of staff capacity. There are currently 370 children in the local look after care system and removed from their families and the Council are currently receiving an inspection on the service.

Traffic measures

In July 2020, Government announced plans to improve cycling and walking uptake across the country in Gear change. As part of this strategy, the Department for Transport (DfT) have begun the process to enable new regulations to provide for Local Authorities to enforce moving traffic contraventions.

Following a decision on 22 July, Herefordshire Council will submit an application to the Department for Transport (DfT) for new moving traffic enforcement (MTE) powers. If successful, the new powers would be in place by the end of 2022, and would enable the council to carry out some enforcement of specified moving traffic offences, helping to improve safety and congestion, and encourage active travel.

Enforcement will be provided through approved camera devices that can detect traffic offences, where a trained Civil Enforcement Officer will then administer a Penalty Charge Notice when appropriate. Enforcement for the most serious offences will still be retained by the police.

One Public Estate Programme



Herefordshire Council is the lead body for the One Public Estate (OPE) partnership in Herefordshire. Partners include Wye Valley Trust, West Mercia Police, Hereford & Worcester Fire and Rescue Service, NHS Herefordshire and Worcestershire (formerly known as Herefordshire and Worcestershire Clinical Commissioning

Group), Taurus Healthcare and the Herefordshire & Worcestershire Health and Care NHS Trust.

OPE is an established national programme delivered in partnership by the Office of Government Property (OGP) within the Cabinet Office and the Local Government Association (LGA). It provides practical and technical support and funding to councils to deliver ambitious property-focused programmes in collaboration with central government and other public sector partners.

At its heart, the programme is about getting more from our collective assets - whether that's catalysing major service transformation such as health and social care integration and benefits reform; unlocking land for new homes and commercial space; or creating new opportunities to save on running costs or generate income. This is encompassed in three core objectives:

- Creating economic growth (new homes and jobs);
- Delivering more integrated, customer-focused services; and
- Generating efficiencies, through capital receipts and reduced running costs;

Herefordshire's OPE Partnership has shown the value of working together across the public sector and taking a strategic approach to asset management. Since the initial successful bid in Wave 5 2016/17, we've successfully bid in four further rounds and secured a grant value of just over £2.8 million.

Phosphates

Progress has been made in achieving certainty with regard to being able to trade phosphate credits with those wishing to build in the north of the country where there is a currently a moratorium in the area defined as the Lugg Catchment.

The Council has bought and is buying land adjacent to water sewerage treatment plants and will block off the discharge pipes and instead make the outfall go through reed beds which will strip all the phosphate out before it enters natural watercourses. Whilst using reed beds to absorb phosphate and other nutrients is not new, being able to calculate the reduction accurately is.

We now have QC's advice that Council's calculator and mechanism for trading is sound and will satisfy Natural England's concerns. This month we will formally take a decision on to press go and trading can start. This is only a mitigation mechanism to allow house building in an area where the moratorium, which remains in place, was preventing all development. The cost of the credits will be added to our funding from the Marches Local Enterprise Partnership and New Homes Bonus and will ensure our wetlands are maintained for 80 years.

Lengthsman Grant

The general lengthsman grant (as opposed to the specific drainage grant) was delayed going through governance but has now completed the process and BBLP will shortly contact parish councils (as they did with the drainage grant) to let them know the process and criteria to bid. This grant funding will be match funding based, with a small base per parish council, that have registered their lengthsman with the Council, calculated on highways length (including footpaths).

The more funding that parish councils are able to and wish to put towards particular, mainly road and ditch, projects in their wards the more match funding they may get from Herefordshire Council. This grant fund will be £250000 total pot spread across the county per year for 5 years guaranteed. We don't expect parishes to tackle major projects with this funding, that remains the responsibility of the Council and our contractor, BBLP, but it will allow minor projects that may have missed out historically on funding because of the ranking matrix approach, we have had to increasingly adhere to since austerity bit, to be tackled.
