Avian Flu - Herefordshire

As you may be aware, we're are still experiencing the biggest avian influenza outbreak we've ever had across the United Kingdom and recently there was an outbreak at Leigh Sinton on the Herefordshire border. Some little time ago Defra announced that it will be a legal requirement for all bird keepers in Great Britain to follow strict biosecurity measures to help protect their flocks from the threat of avian flu. Further information can be found on their website and please share this with anyone in our agricultural communities who may be directly affected by this.

This has meant that from 7 November 2022 it is a **legal requirement** for **all bird keepers** to keep their birds indoors and to follow strict biosecurity measures including:

- housing or netting all poultry and captive birds
- cleanse and disinfect clothing, footwear, equipment and vehicles before and after contact with poultry and captive birds if practical, use disposable protective clothing
- reduce the movement of people, vehicles or equipment to and from areas where poultry and captive birds are kept, to minimise contamination from manure, slurry and other products, and use effective vermin control
- keep records of mortality, movement of poultry and poultry products and any changes in production
- thoroughly cleanse and disinfect housing on a continuous basis
- keep fresh disinfectant at the right concentration at all farm and poultry housing entry and exit points
- minimise direct and indirect contact between poultry and captive birds and wild birds, including making sure all feed and water is not accessible to wild birds
- prevent access by poultry to ponds and watercourses and ensure that birds are kept in fenced or enclosed areas

Avian influenza circulates naturally in wild birds and when they migrate to the UK from mainland Europe over the winter they can spread the disease to poultry and other captive birds. Bird keepers should visit the avian flu guidance on gov.uk for full details of the AIPZ and updated biosecurity guidance. The UK health agencies advise that the risk to public health from the virus is very low and the UK food standards agencies advise that avian influenzas pose a very low food safety risk for UK consumers. Properly cooked poultry and poultry products, including eggs, are safe to eat.

Do not touch or pick up any dead or sick birds that you find. If you find dead swans, geese or ducks or other dead wild birds, such as gulls or birds of prey, they should be reported to the Defra Helpline.

Cost of living: helping with childcare costs

There's recent government funding available to help with childcare costs. HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) announced last week that they're encouraging families across the UK to not miss the opportunity for government-funded help towards their childcare. More info https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/

Families could save up to £2,000 a year towards their childcare costs to help pay for wraparound care during the school terms. More than 391,000 families saved money on their childcare costs in June 2022, worth a total of £41.6 million in top-up payments, and HMRC is reminding thousands of other families to not miss the chance to save up to £500 every 3 months, or £1,000 if their child is disabled.

Families can sign up to Tax-Free Childcare to help pay for holiday clubs, before and after-school clubs, childminders and nurseries, and other approved childcare schemes. It is available to families with children up to the age of 11, or 17 if their child has a disability. The government will pay 20% of childcare costs by topping up the money paid into a Tax-Free Childcare account. This means for every £8 paid into the online account, families will automatically receive an additional £2 in government top-up.

Childrens' Services - news and update

Council continues to provide additional funding for Herefordshire Children's Services Herefordshire Council Cabinet approved the use of £6.49m funding at a meeting held on Thursday 24 November 2022, to continue to transform Herefordshire Children's Social Care

The £6.49m investment is the remaining amount of £11.49m funding, previously approved by Cabinet in March 2022. The funding will help to ensure the council's children's services are adequately resourced and can provide a more secure and resilient service to Herefordshire children and their families in

Teams Meeting – with Eleanor Brazil (commentary from other colleague – also present)

At a recent meeting with a family who have had problems with the Council children's services department, I received and listened to the parent concerns. Subsequently, I challenged senior officers and with support the family have now started to make headway with their situation.

I attended a Teams briefing with the Government's appointed Inspector Eleanor Brazil who gave us feedback on her initial findings. In the session, identified for one hour long she was not asked to speak until after 50 minutes, which continues to demonstrate, in my view, a lack of proper understanding by those in charge concerning the seriousness of the situation.

Ms Brazil spoke of finding a department with a sense of chaos with a culture not supportive of families and children. She said there should be more systematic and robust management of casework responding to family concerns, with improved tracking processes. The IT systems are not helping good practice - poor data resulting in no accurate picture that can describe the performance of the service. Far too many agency staff being used. Staff need to return to offices at Plough Lane to be able to work together, talk and share experience and knowledge. New staff need to be appointed to support the administration processes to release Children social workers to do their job at the front line.

Some of the extra funding put into the service during the last 18 months could have been better spent. Despite previous court comments and inspections action has been slow. Better focus on how funding is spend is required going forward. Partnerships with other public agencies were not well developed. She will be making a recommendation to the Secretary of State midway through this month. Recruiting, retaining and sustaining staff levels will be critical to improve the service. Currently there are the demands of the historic cases to deal with as well as running the service on a daily basis. To improve this service will have a financial cost which is bound to have an impact on other services in the county. Notwithstanding, it goes without saying that all children in Herefordshire must be safe.

Additionally, I with other councillors are not reassured by the information we as elected members are receiving. Despite being told number of children subject to a child protection plan is lower, number of children in care falling – no numbers to evidence are given.

Ward Report – December 2022

For over 12 months we have had a Children's improvement board and it is difficult to see what positive impact it has had. We are still awaiting after over two years a report regarding peer on peer abuse in the county.

National changes to Telcare Service

You may remember last month that I reported on an issue relating to the 'digital switchover 2025', which is when existing analogue telephone lines, which use old copper wiring, will be switched off. This decision has been made by the communications industry which owns the copper lines due to the high cost of maintaining the infrastructure.

I have had a number of meetings and have communicated by email with the cabinet member but still there is no satisfactory response as to where Herefordshire is in the greater scheme of things.

The new Telcare equipment is supplied by a company called Tele alarm. If you're a Telcare prescriber within the Independent Living Service (ILS), the **new equipment will be visible** for you to order on IRIS from 7 November. **In order for the transition to the new stock lines to take place**, ILS prescribers are asked not to place any orders for Telecare equipment after 2.30pm on Friday 4 November.

I am assured, that those residents with Telcare will have their emergency needs taken care of before the switchover occurs. My concern relates to and is still of concern that those who have other providers will not be subject to 'loss of service' when the analogue system is switched off. Therefore there needs to be more work done with the other providers and the assurance to residents with other providers. To this end I am raising a question in Full Council next Friday to the cabinet member as to the current situation regarding assurance that no resident will cease to have emergency cover when analogue is switched off – sometime between now and 2025.

Health Improvement - Flu Vaccination

With winter on the way, it's now time to top up your immunity with an annual flu vaccine, and autumn COVID-19 booster, if you are eligible. This will help keep you, and those you care for, safer this winter. For some people flu and COVID-19 can be serious, and for those in public facing roles, like health or social care worker, you're more likely to be exposed to the flu and COVID-19 viruses.

Did you know:-

- More people get these viruses over winter, which is why it's important that you get your flu vaccine, and COVID-19 autumn vaccine if you are eligible, as soon as you are offered it.
- More people are also likely to get flu this winter as fewer people will have built up natural immunity to it during the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Vaccination is the best protection against getting seriously ill from flu and COVID-19, and spreading it to others, including your colleagues, the people you care for and friends and family.

NHS flu vaccination programme

You are eligible to receive the vaccine free on the NHS if you are aged 50 years and over (including those who'll be 50 by 31 March 2023), pregnant, a carer or if you have certain health conditions. If you are in one of these groups then you will be contacted by your GP Practice when it's your turn to come forward. Alternatively, a number of community pharmacies also offer the NHS vaccination, contact nearest community pharmacy for more information and to book an appointment.

Autumn COVID boosters

The autumn COVID booster programme has started. If you are eligible, your GP surgery will contact you when it's your turn to be vaccinated. Alternatively, those aged 65 years old and over, frontline health and social care workers, those at higher risk or who are pregnant, and people who have or live with someone who has a weakened immune system can book a vaccine online.

The appointment dates you'll be offered will start from 3 months (91 days) after your previous dose. Visit the NHS website to book or manage your coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination.

The first stage of work to take over the council's electric vehicle charge point network is now complete. The council announced in July that it would be expanding the existing network, in partnership with Wenea.

Over the next two years, the number of charge point bays will increase with more provision planned as demand increases. There will be a switch to more rapid charging and support for residents who have to park on the street.

Fuel Poverty Awareness

2nd December was Fuel Poverty Awareness Day, and as more households across the county are struggling to pay their energy bills, Herefordshire Council remind residents that there is local support available

Energy prices have risen by unprecedented levels this year, and for households across Herefordshire the full effects of the crisis are now being felt. In the past, fuel poverty was something that usually affected around 10% of the population, but across the UK this figure is changing dramatically. Official estimates put current fuel poverty numbers in Herefordshire at 23,876 households, which amounts to an unbelievable 28% of all households in the county. This is up from just under 17% before the energy crisis – which was already well above the national average.

With the cost of living rising across, it's not surprising that many people are feeling despondent, stressed and fearful about what the next year will bring. Following this Fuel Poverty Awareness Day, the Council want our residents to know that there is support available, and that they don't have to struggle with their energy alone. Keep Herefordshire Warm is a fuel poverty and energy efficiency advice service funded by Herefordshire Council and run by fuel poverty charity Severn Wye. The service provides a Freephone advice line,

tailored 1:1 energy support, and administering grant funding for home energy improvements. They also provide emergency funding for residents who find themselves in a no heat situation.

Food, fuel and finances (and how households can get help!)

The Household Support Fund provided by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) is here to help those hardest hit by the cost of living.

The scheme focuses on helping to pay for or supply food and energy bills, as well as other essential household items.

Funding has been given to voluntary and community organisations to help local residents who are struggling. Some of the organisations take direct applications, whilst many need a referral from local support agencies, such as social workers, housing associations and <u>Citizens</u> Advice Herefordshire.

Following the government approval, the council will establish grant schemes for launch as the funds become available from April 2023.

- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away you were at the time;
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.
